2016 Annual Report

IREC was created with a vision to provide much needed support for the less fortunate sections of our society. Your generous contributions to IREC are used to provide education, food, emergency relief, shelter and welfare to poor, orphans, underprivileged children and widows in India. We work throughout the year to assess the needs of poor and minorities in poverty struck rural areas of India and develop projects based on their needs. We have a dedicated team of visionary leaders and organizations on site in India working to improve social and economic status of the beneficiaries so that minorities & poor in India can have the opportunities to reach their full potential, contribute to society, live and work in dignity.

IREC makes sure that all the contributions from its donors are utilized in an efficient way. Transparency and accountability is paramount to everything that we do as an organization. Following is a detailed annual report of all the activities undertaken by IREC, including the expenses incurred during the year 2016.

Tuition Assistance Program

Synopsis:

Education is a tool that takes care of not just the needy individual but their generations. Providing educational opportunities to the children and youth of struggling families is another program that is funded by your contributions.

These are very hard working individuals that benefit immensely from this program. IREC provides funding in the form of total annual fees to individuals from KG to Degree programs paid directly to the educational institution. Given the sensitivity and seriousness of this program, we take this to the next level by closely monitoring the performance of the students that are benefitted by your funds. To keep the students motivated and on track for the best utilization of your funds, grades are monitored on a regular basis. Counseling is provided to students to keep them on track to succeed.

Out of the total of 113 student beneficiaries, 56 students maintain a meritorious grade of A+ & A.

Apart from paying tuition fees to the 113 students we also run after school board examination coaching for another 174 students. This is done by setting up coaching classes and paying salaries to the coaching staff. We hire highly qualified and experienced teachers who help in improving the performance of the students to succeed in board exams.

Synopsis:

Medical emergencies can turn into critical life and death situations. These can alter the family structure and also cause an immense financial stress. With the development of technology, the costs of medical treatment have significantly increased making it harder for the people.

People who are not able to afford treatment reach out to IREC for help with various medical conditions. We provide the necessary guidance and financial help to these ailing patients. Funds are paid to the hospitals towards their bills and cost of medications.

Orphan and Poor Girls Marriage Support

One of the major areas your donations are used is to provide financial support for marriages of orphan girls and girls belonging to poor families. After an application is received, IREC and its volunteers make a thorough effort to verify the financial status of the girls we support for marriage, making sure that the money is given to deserving girls and also that the money is spent only on absolute necessities of the marriage.

During this financial year IREC was able to identify and support 14 marriages, out of which 6 were orphan girls and 8 girls belonging to poor families. This support, provided in the form of financial aid, was determined on a case by case basis. A total of Rs. 192,000 was utilized to support this noble cause.

Widow and Destitute Families Support

Monetary support to the widows, orphans and destitute families is another way IREC utilizes your donations. The beneficiaries are identified by going through a verification and screening process that includes visiting the houses and verifying their living conditions and socio economic status. Once a family is identified as a deserving recipient of your monthly donations, IREC will provide a monthly support to meet the basic household expenses. The amount is determined on the basis of family size and their needs. These payments are deposited directly to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

During 2016, IREC supported 12 families disbursing a total of Rs 343,500 throughout the year.

Ramadan Food Drive Program

IREC volunteers work tirelessly to identify families that struggle immensely for two essential meals of the day. Every year during Ramadan, IREC delivers food packets to such needy families. During this year, Alhamdulillah we were able to distribute food supplies to more than 250 families. Also in 2016, by the mercy of Allah, Your donations to IREC put smiles on the faces of 62 orphan children who were gifted with new clothes for Eid celebration.

Bore Wells and Construction Programs

There are many rural areas that struggle for drinking water. Families have to travel long distances to get a pot of water. IREC identifies such areas and constructs bore wells.

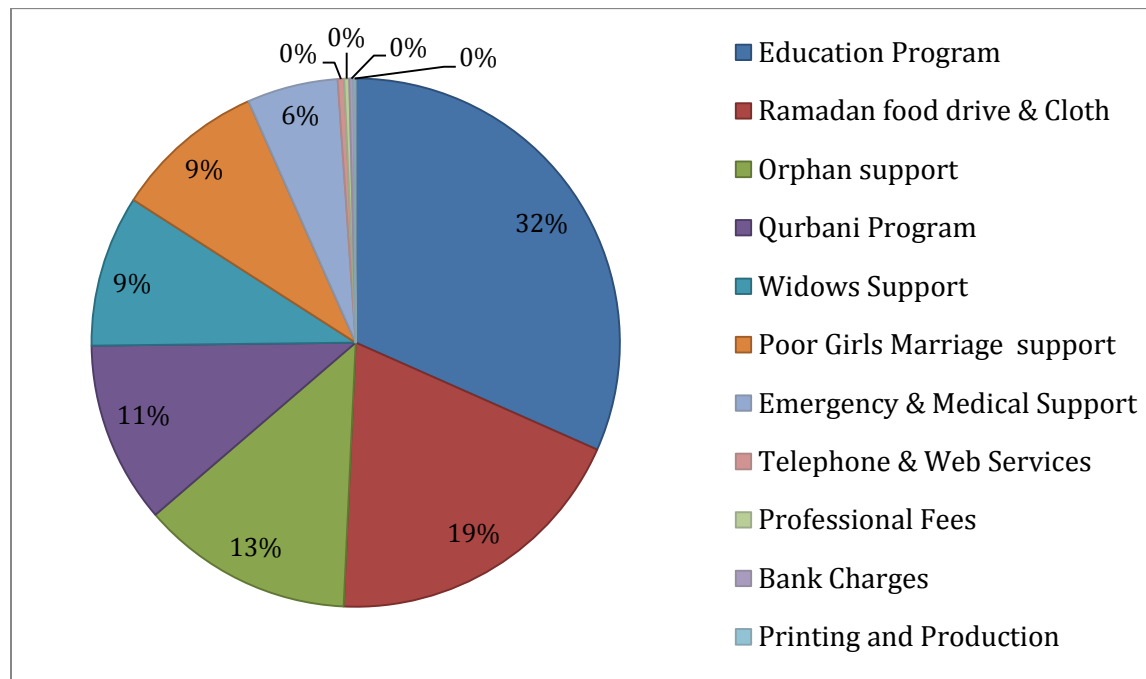
Each bore well costs Rs 67,000 (\$1000) to install. We plan to continue this project in the future with generous contribution from donors like you and our goal is to reach more rural areas that are desperate without water In Shaa Allah.

Your donations are also used to support essential construction projects in rural area schools.

In 2016, IREC was able to complete one bore well and funded renovation of two schools.
